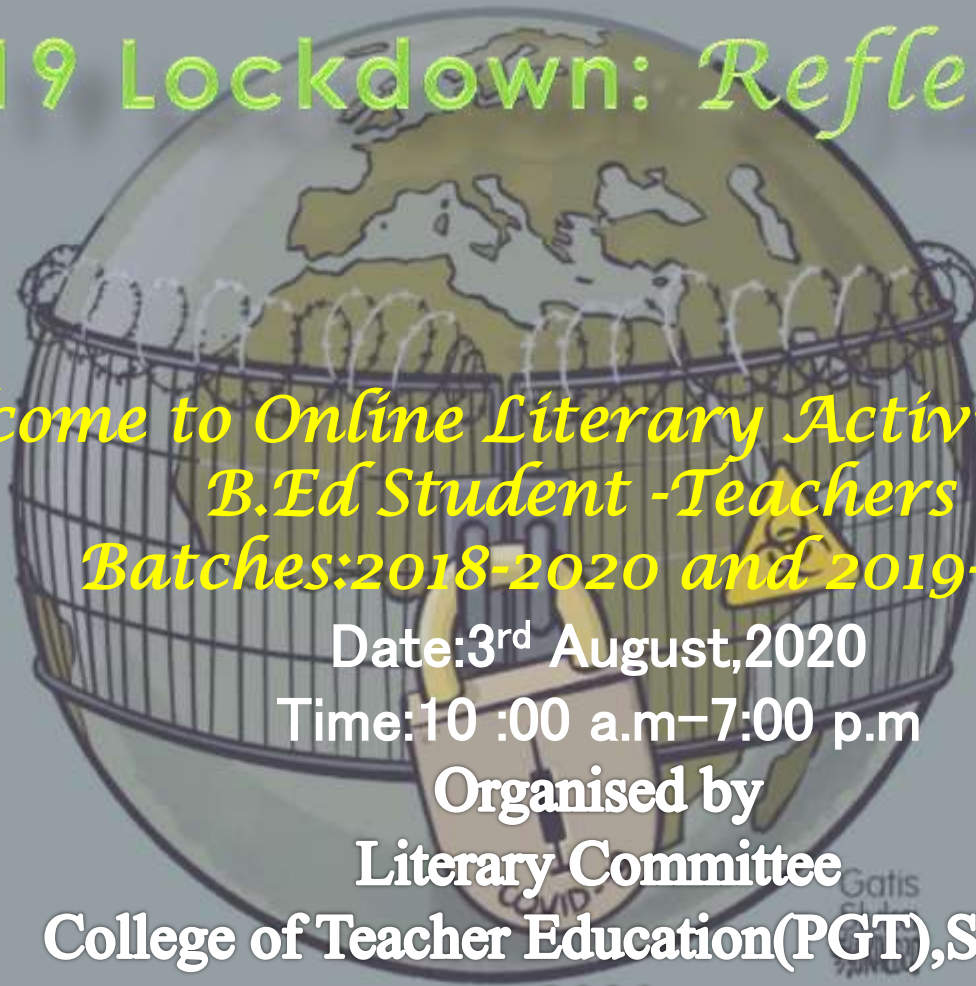

INFORMATION & ANALYTICAL

Point of differences	Informational report	Analytical report
1. Definition	The report which includes only presentation of information is known as informational report.	Analytical reports are based on analyzed data.
2. Recommendation	Recommendations are not provided by this type of report.	Recommendations are an indispensable part of analytical report.
3. Length	Length of this report is small.	Length of analytical report is much longer than that of informational report.
4. Time	It takes short time to prepare informational report.	It is time consuming.
5. Special Knowledge	To prepare this type of report, the reporter needs not to have any special knowledge.	On the other hand to prepare analytical report the reporter needs special knowledge.
6. Format	Specific format need not to be followed.	Following a specific format is essential.
7. Importance	Informational reports are not much important for decision making.	Analytical reports have immense importance in decision making.
8. Cost	It is less costly	Preparation of analytical reports is more costly than other types of reports.
