PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE



The College of Teacher Education (PGT) is an island of serenity amid the hustle and bustle of urban Shillong. Erstwhile known as the Post-Graduate Training College, Shillong, the College of Teacher Education (PGT), Shillong, was established on March 19, 1964, during Swami Vivekananda's centenary year. The College was founded by Prof. S. C. Mazumdar to train Secondary School teachers for the United Khasi and Jaintia Hills in undivided Assam, with initial support from Shri. S. C. Rajkhowa (DPI Assam). The College operated its classes from the premises of Jail Road Boys' High School until 1971 and then shifted to its current site at Boyce Road, Laitumkhrah, Shillong in 1972.

In 1986, the Government of Meghalaya brought the College under the Deficit Grant-in-aid system and was granted permanent Affiliation to the North Eastern Hill University on 1st November 1986. Further, the College was included under 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956, on 27.10.1990, which was a significant milestone, making it eligible to receive Central Assistance under Section 12(b) of the UGC Act 1956. The College has been conferred recognition by the National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE) under Section 14 of the NCTE Act, F. No. 2799 (12) dated 11.02.1997. The College is also registered as a Society under the Meghalaya Societies Registration Act, 1983, since 30th June 2004. The College was accredited by NAAC with a B Grade (CGPA 2.81).

After over 60 years of dedicated service to teacher education in Meghalaya, the College of Teacher Education (PGT), Shillong, exemplifies robust character through adaptation, innovation, and change. In its endeavour to evolve into a multidisciplinary institution to implement NEP 2020, the College has completed formalities to launch a fully college-managed B.A. Program from the 2026 academic session. The College of Teacher Education (PGT) Shillong remains committed to enhancing facilities, developing infrastructure, and delivering an excellent learning experience for its students now and in the years to come.

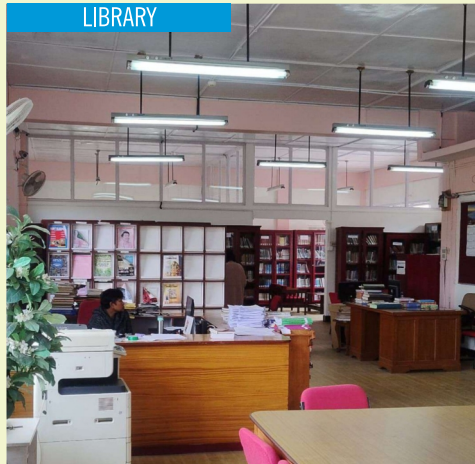
Infrastructure and Facilities

The college spans 5,685.83 sq. m. of land and 3,960.79 sq. m. of built-up area at Boyce Road, Laitumkhrah, Shillong, with a proposed 2-acre extension campus at Umsawli. Key facilities include an auditorium, computer laboratory, counselling room, psychological laboratory, gymnasium, separate hostels for male and female students, library-cum-reading room, separate common rooms for male and female students, conference room, language laboratory, science laboratory, canteen, working-cum-teaching aids room, safe drinking water, fire safety, and CCTV surveillance.

ADMISSION POLICY

Admission is available for the B.A. 1st Semester of the Academic Session 2026. The admission procedure starts from the day of announcement/declaration of Class XII or Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSS result of MBOSE/ ISC/CBSE). Application in the prescribed form will be available either by visiting the College or by checking the College website <https://ctepgtshillong.com>.

Eligibility criteria for admission:

- I. 45% marks in aggregate at the Higher Secondary Level
- ii. 45% marks in English
- iii. 5% seats are reserved under the other category, such as sports quota for outstanding sports persons, EWS, etc.

Each application form must be accompanied by:

- i. Self-attested copy of marksheet & Certificate of SSLC Examination.
- ii. Self-attested copy of the marksheet of the HSSLC examination.
- iii. ST/SC certificate for ST/SC students.
- iv. Certificate as proof for the relevant other categories.
- v. 2 recent passport-size photographs.
- vi. A Transfer Certificate from the School/College last attended.
- vii. A Migration Certificate in original be submitted within 30 days of getting admission for students from outside the jurisdiction of MBOSE.

Incomplete application forms or application forms submitted without the required documents will be rejected. Application forms submitted after the last date will not be considered. The selected students must get themselves admitted by paying the prescribed fees within the time frame to be notified by the College; otherwise, the admission stands cancelled.

As per the guidelines of North Eastern Hill University, NEP 2020, the BA Course is introduced as a four-year undergraduate programme (FYUP) and is multi-disciplinary in nature. In the first semester, a student shall select one Major subject and one Minor subject out of the list of subjects as specified in the Prospectus. Once selected, the Major and Minor subjects shall be continued till the completion of the Undergraduate programme.

Regular classes will commence from the date as and when notified by the Principal.

Rules of Comportment

- I. 75% attendance is compulsory to sit for the final examination.
